

APPG ON PENSION SCAMS DATA PRIVACY NOTICE FOR CONSTITUENTS

The APPG on Pension Scams processes your personal data for the purposes of maintaining a record of constituent enquiries and, with your permission, for assisting with your Member of Parliament regarding your individual case.

The data which we obtain from you and store on our records is:

- Your name and email address
- Your Job title and the name of your company (*if applicable*)
- The name of your Member of Parliament
- Any other information you have shared with us (*if applicable*)

We use this data to send you information about the APPG and its work, and (only with your and your MP's consent) assist with your own individual case.

Our lawful basis for processing your personal data for the purposes of maintaining a record of constituent enquiries is that the processing is necessary for your legitimate interest. Our lawful basis for processing your personal data for assisting with your Member of Parliament is that the processing is necessary for your legitimate interest and that you have given us your consent to process your personal data.

We will hold this information securely and we will keep this information for one year after the current parliament ends. We will not share your personal data with a third party. Your data is stored on secure password protected online drive with protection from Parliament's digital security.
